



PRESS RELEASE

The Cumberland County Sheriff's Office is investigating a Hit and Run Accident, involving a bicyclist, that occurred at approximately, 3:45 p.m. today on Route 114 about .2 miles from s Harmon's Beach Rd. in Standish.

The victim is a male in his 40's (name is being withheld until family can be contacted) was wearing a helmet when he was struck by a vehicle, the vehicle fled before the Sheriff's Office arrived. The bicyclist has been transported to Maine Medical Center in Portland and is in serious condition. At this time the Sheriff's Office is looking for a Dark colored, possibly dark Blue mini-van and should show damage to the outside passenger mirror.

The Sheriff's Office is encouraging anyone who may have information or to the driver of the vehicle to contact the Sheriff's Office at, 893-2810.

If additional information becomes available a supplemental Release will follow.

ADDED INFORMATION:

The name of the bicyclist is, Michael Tetrault, 45 years old from Standish. Additional information about the vehicle is that it's possibly a mini-van or SUV style vehicle.

ADDED INFORMATION/05-09-07

The Sheriff's Office has been conducting follow-up investigation in re-constructing the Hit and Run Accident. It was determined today that the side view mirror that appears to have broken off when the victim bicyclist was struck was to a, *2002 - 2005 Chevy S-10 pickup with heated side mirrors*. The investigation continues.
